During language acquisition, German children from six years on use structures that are similar to those of adults in their language group and also encode all semantic components from an early age. Nonetheless, in addition to these striking cross-linguistic differences, the results of this study also clearly show similar developmental progressions in other respects, suggesting the impact of general developmental determinants.
